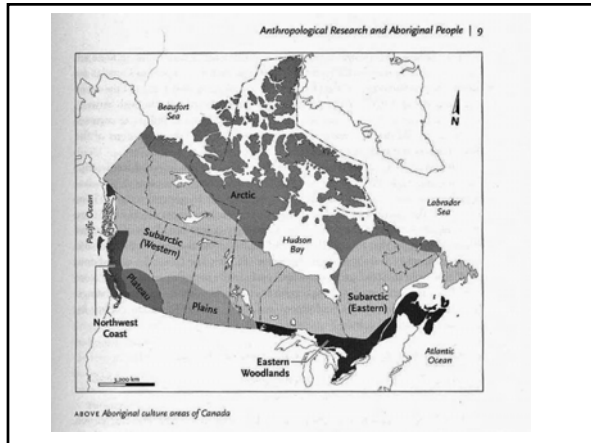


Culture Areas in Canada

Eastern Woodlands: Maritimes

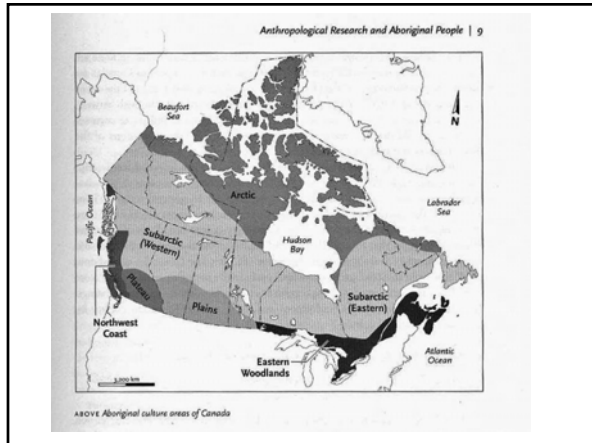

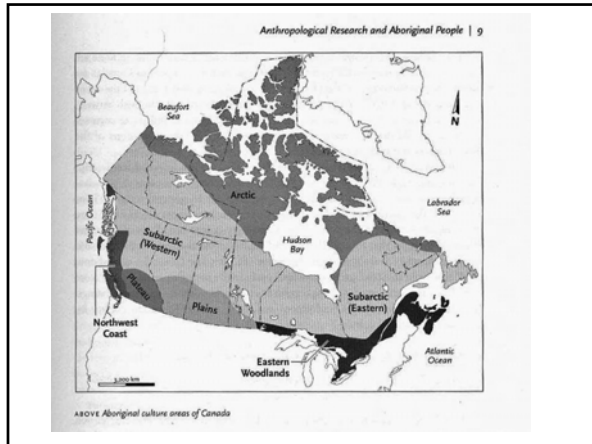
ABOVE Aboriginal culture areas of Canada

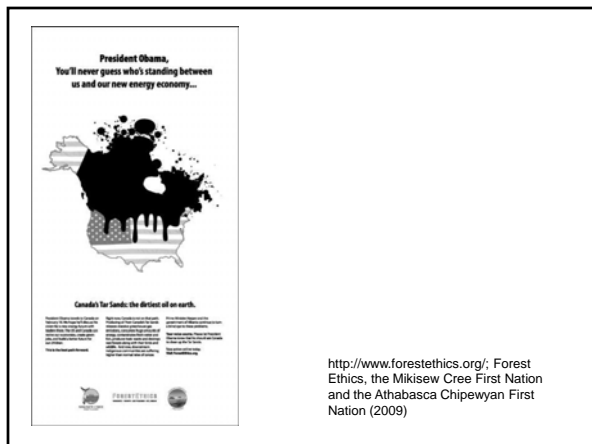


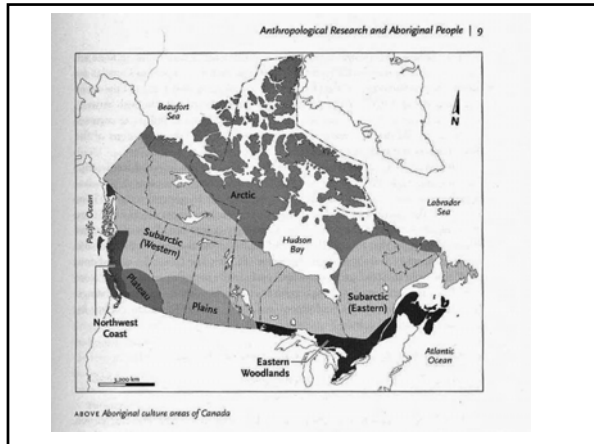
NATO test flights and war games in INNU territory (Labrador, Canada) 2000+ a year

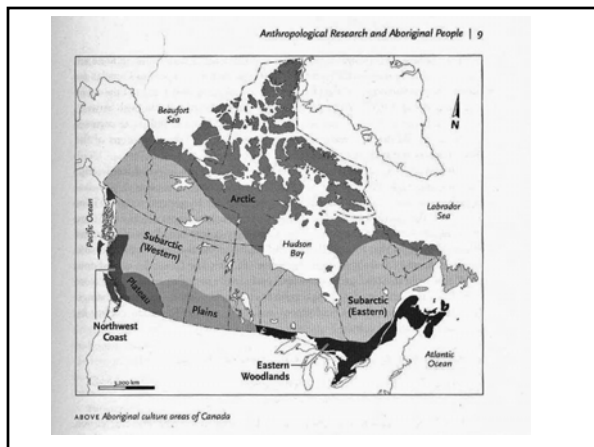

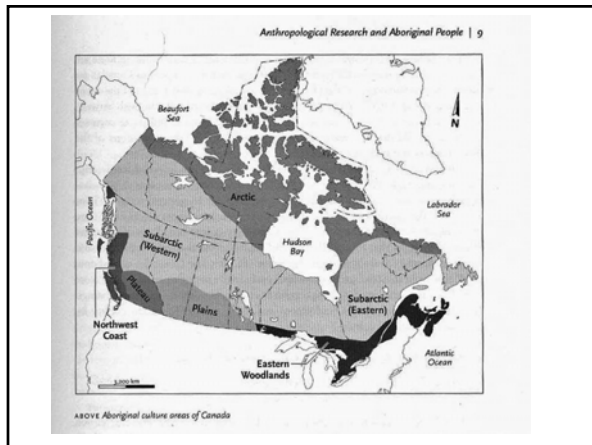

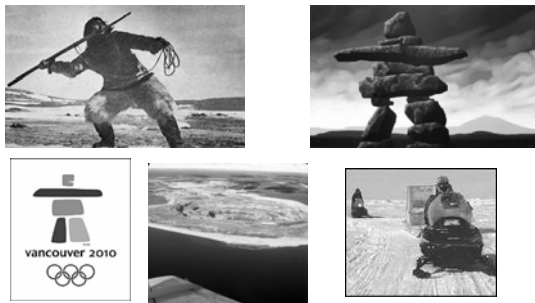
